

GENERAL NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS:

This trial is sanctioned by the Agility Association of Canada, with Royackers Kennels as the host club. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of AAC rules & regulation including but not limited to the following:

-This event is held under AAC rules & regulations and is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, purebred or mixed breed, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs showing signs of aggression.

-All dogs must have an official AAC identification card. Dogs cannot compete if they have not been issued an ID Card.

-Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the rules and regulations of the AAC and shall conform to AAC specifications. There will not be an official familiarization of equipment. However, warm up jumps will be provided.

-No leads, collars, food, toys or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course.

-It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour, may be asked to leave the show grounds and NO REFUND of fees paid will be made.

-Exhibitors MUST keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please pick up after yourselves, your guests and your dogs.

-The host club reserves the right to refuse any entry.

-There will be no refunds, cancellations or changes after the closing date, except for move-ups as per AAC regulations, bitches that come into season or dogs that have been injured provided that the trial secretary is notified at least one week prior to the trial date and a certificate from a veterinarian is provided.

-Any dog earning a title after the closing date of this trial is eligible to move up to the next level.

Please note: Abuse in any form, of the volunteers, competitors or the judge will not be tolerated. Anyone disrupting the trial due to poor sportsmanship or abusive behaviour, will be dismissed from the trial. Fees will not be refunded and any legs earned to that point will be null.

Prizes and Awards:

A qualifying ribbon will be awarded to all dogs that achieve a qualifying round in any class. In each of the Starters, Advanced & Masters classes: ribbons will be awarded 1st to 4th in each height division.

PERFORMANCE LEVELS & CLASS DESCRIPTION

There are three performance levels: Starters, Advanced and Masters.

There are 3 class levels: Regular, Special and Veteran

AAC Starters Class:

The starters class shall be for dogs not having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title.

AAC Advanced Class:

The advanced class shall be for dogs that having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title, but that have not earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title.

AAC Masters Class:

The masters class shall be for dogs having earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title.

AAC Veterans Class:

These classes shall be for dogs seven years of age and older or dogs 5 years of age and older who have been competing in the Special classes for a minimum of 1 year.

AAC Special Classes:

These classes are open to all dogs. A dog may no longer compete in Regular titling classes after being entered at an official trial in any Special class. A dog entered in Special classes may move to the Veteran classes

Steeplechase: is a class offered at only one level, but open to all dogs, (starters/advanced and masters compete together), It is a fast, moving course consisting of jumps, tire, tunnels, weave poles and A-frame. Scoring is time plus faults.

GAMES: Classes are offered at 3 levels: Starters, Advance and Masters.

DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE: (also see maps on our website – royackers.com)

From the 401:

#401 to #6 north, through Guelph

Turn left onto #7 (Woodlawn Rd.)

At the lights at the car dealerships, turn right onto Regional Rd. #86 (Elmira Road)

Go through 2 sets of lights in the country. Next road turn right onto 8th Line

At the 3rd road turn right onto Sideroad 12 - we are 1st place on the left

From Fergus:

Leave Fergus on the #6 towards Guelph

Take 1st right onto the 2nd Line (Stone Retailer)

Go to the end and turn left onto Wellington Rd. #7 (Elora Rd.)

Take the first road right (Sideroad 10)

Take the 3rd road left (6th Line)

Take the 1st road right (Sideroad 12). We are the 1st place on the right..
